Our Vote411 Director, Deb Helber has uploaded the candidate information for both Dare and Currituck Counties. She has succeeded in getting more and more candidates to participate and 100% of Dare candidates have responded. BIG shout out to Deb for her contributions.

Early voting is open and the last day to vote early is Saturday, March 2 between 8:00 am to 3:00 pm. You can vote at any location; Manteo Dare County Administration building, Kill Devil Hills town hall or Buxton Fessenden Center. The advantages of one stop early voting include same-day registration and voting. The new voter rules are in effect, so remember to bring your valid photo ID. If you wait to vote on Primary Election Day March 5, 2024, you must report to your assigned voting place.

Government Day Presentation for Leadership OBX

Our Co-President, Ginger Walters, introduced League of Women Voters of Dare County to the 2024 class of Leadership OBX sponsored by the Outer Banks Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber asked LWV of Dare to provide the goals and mission for League of Women Voters and to discuss elections in Dare County. The session was held on Wednesday, January 31st in the county commissioners' meeting room.

LWV of Dare was the first presenter for Government Day which included officials and elected representatives to discuss the innerworkings of government. Representatives and officials of local towns, county government and state representatives including Senator Bobby Hanig explained government policies to the group.



Ginger gave a terrific overview of our mission and goals. Due to unforeseen circumstances, Ginger only had a 12-hour notice to make this presentation. Nevertheless, she made a positive impression on the leadership class. Ginger stepped up and gave a professional presentation to this large group. She started with her personal story about why she joined the League. She explained our suffragist history, our three-tier organization of local, state and national all focused toward our mission of defending democracy and educating voters. Ginger highlighted that we are all volunteers serving our community. We believe in the power of women to create a more perfect democracy. We support an informed, active and healthy community that participates in all facets of voting and participation in a free and open democracy.



During the discussion, Ginger provided flyers and brochures for our organization. She explained that our Citizen's Guide brings important local contacts to Dare residents. Ginger described our Vote411 website and the election information available to the public. She talked about changes in voting laws and the efforts of LWV to help voters understand the new rules. Ginger also highlighted our programs and events like Human Trafficking and Dare to Share. She spoke about our advocacy and dedication to tackle difficult topics.

Afterwards there were numerous questions from the group, including a question from Senator Hanig. He gave high praise to LWV and stated that "they do so much more" and thanked us for our service to the community. Thank you Ginger!

Education Report

This report first covers interesting business and program information presented, discussed, and/or approved at the local Dare Board of Education level during the fall and winter of the 2023-24 school year. Secondly, information is outlined about how the 2023-24 State budget, policy changes, and a court challenge affect education in North Carolina.

Local

The BOE added three student "advisors" in the fall of 2023. All girls, they come from Manteo High, Cape Hatteras Secondary School, and First Flight High. They appear at each meeting leading the pledge of allegiance to the flag and presenting information about happenings at the ten Dare schools and the Learning Academy, formerly the Alternative School. At the end of each Board meeting, the make comments along with the elected

members.

- In December 2023 at the annual reorganizational meeting the group ended the one-year chairmanship and vice-chairmanship of Ron Payne and Barry Wickre. David Twiddy and Carl Woody were elected to the chair and vice-chair positions by 4-3 votes, the same ratio as the vote in 2022. Twiddy had served as chair for several years prior to December 2022.
- Athletics were front and center at meetings this school year. The FFH boys' soccer team won a state championship last fall and the MHS girls' soccer team also won a state championship for spring 2023, each in its division. Manteo High soccer Ralph Cleaver was named the 2022-2023 NC Coach of the year by the National Federation of State High School Associations. Soccer coach Juan Ramirez of FFHS was named the 2023 Boy's Fall Mid-Atlantic Soccer Coach of the Year by the United Soccer Coaches Association. All were honored at meetings.
- A new DCS library vision is being launched as part of a 5-year plan. There is a mission statement and logo to bring attention to the new focus: "Love Literacy, Love Learning, Love Libraries # Check out Dare." A FFHS student designed the logo.

National Popular Vote

THE U.S. LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS ENDORSES THE ELECTION OF THE PRESIDENT & VICE PRESIDENT BY DIRECT POPULAR VOTE. THE NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE (NPV) COMPACT IS THE SOLUTION!

The Electoral College system creates serious issues:

- In the last 6 presidential elections, 2 candidates were declared the winners without earning a majority of the votes cast nationally. (In total, this has happened 5 times in U.S. history.)
- "Swing" states, those whose outcome is unsure, receive an overwhelming majority of campaign events. In 2020, 96% of campaign events occurred in just 12 states. This over-weighted attention to a minority of states /voters was similar in 2016 and 2012.
- "Swing" states also receive 7% more federal grants, twice as many presidential disaster declarations, and more Superfund enforcement exemptions … Coincidence?
- "Swing" states represent only 20% of the U.S. population but have an outsized impact on Presidential elections.



· Consequently, presidential candidates have little reason to pay attention to the issues or concerns of voters in states where the statewide outcome is a foregone conclusion.


